RED RIBBON CAMPAIGN

It's not too soon to begin thinking of the Red Ribbon Campaign for the Holiday Season. This year we have a goal of getting 10,000 ribbons out in our local areas. This marks the 25th Anniversary of MADD, so special ribbons will be available through local MADD Chapters. They are silver with red logo and lettering, saying "25th Anniversary MADD Celebrates Life". Traditional red ribbons are also available. All ribbons come packed 3,000 to a box and cost \$49.50 including freight and delivery charge. This is for 18" ribbons. 24" strips are \$57.71 per carton.

Because there will be such a large demand for this special ribbon, please make arrangements with your local MADD Chapter by September, so the ribbons arrive in sufficient time for the campaign.

She believes that it will be both a tribute and memorial to those lives lost, if their lives and stories could save the life of another.

Under the Public Disclosure Act, Chapter 42.17 RCW, information about the DUI Victim Memorial Sign Program, such as the sign sponsors names, addresses, and phone numbers, is considered public information. However, respecting privacy, Ms. Drummond has chosen to gather information only from families who contact her for that purpose.


